The school society plans to upgrade the classes to higher secondary level. There is a proposition of taking the school to further success storey by promoting it to the level of degree college eventually.


EXAM SCHEDULE

PUPIL'S CODE OF CONDUCT

Discipline, the essence of life is inevitable for the success of an organization. It costs nothing but pays rich dividends. A school is one place where the seeds of discipline are sown in a child. Here, at D.A.V. COLLEGIATE SCHOOL, we make every possible effort to make our students imbibe this precious virtue as an integral part of their personality. So as a part of this prestigious institution, it becomes obligatory on the part of every one to adhere to the rules and regulations of the school.

Upholding Discipline

Self-discipline is the forte of the school

- •The school begins at 8:00 a.m. in summer and 9:00 a.m. in winter for students of all classes. All students are expected to reach the school before the bell rings.
- •After the arrival time school gates are closed and entry is permitted only through the main gate (reception side).
- Those who are habitually late, disciplinary action is taken against them.
- School uniform is a discipline in itself and should be adhered to by all the students. Students are expected to wear the proper uniform as specified by the school and in proper manner.
- students are advised to keep their classrooms / school building / campus neat and clean. Waste material and leftovers must be thrown into the dustbins only.
- •Students should observe polite civil behavior. Shouting, bullying or use of foul language is forbidden.
- •Under no pretext should a student miss any teaching / games / activity period.

Attendance / Leave / Absence

- •Student's leave has to be approved by the appropriate authority.
- •Medical certificate is necessary in case of absence for more than three days to sickness.
- •Repeated absence without leave or unexplained absence for more than 10 consecutive days renders the students liable to have his / her name struck off the rolls. Re-admission may be granted only on payment of fresh admission fee.
- •It is compulsory for students to complete 75% of their attendance in the academic year to make them eligible to appear for their final examination. The percentage , however, could be relaxed on medical grounds.
- •Mandatory minimum attendance for classes 1st 9th is 75% as per CBSE guidelines.
- •Irregular attendance, habitual idleness, disobedience or defiance of authority, lack of sufficent improvement in studies and conduct even after warnings is a sufficient reason for the explusion of a student.
- •Appreciation Certificate are awarded to classes Play Pen -10^{th} for maintaining 100% attendance through the academic year.

Behaviour / Deportment / Speech

- •Study diligently and attentively in the class room, never waste your time while at schools.
- •Keep your class room clean; throw waste paper(s) into the waste paper baskets only.
- •Be ready to pick up good habits and shun bad ones; learn the social manners and prepare yourself for health citizenship in a democratic society.
- •Be courteous, respectful and considerate to the parents, teachers, visitors and the schoolmates.
- •Always be thankful, "Please and Thank you" are the key words in human behavior; adopt them as a matter of habit.
- •Be polite to all, remember, politeness costs nothing but buys everything.
- •Be ready to lend a helping hand at home to parents, brothers and sisters, at School to teachers and copanions.

Students should not -

- •Be late for the school.
- Bring objectionable literature.
- •Leave the school during working hours unless the parents / guardians whose signature are on the admission forms and the school diary come in person.
- •Writing or drawing anything on the walls / school furniture / library books.
- •Scribbling or writing anything on the school uniform.
- •Bringing costly or undesirable articles to school like Cell Phones, CDs, Video Cassettes, Cameras, costly watches and ornaments. The school authorities will not be responsible for such loss.
- •Bringing of any equipment / material which may cause injury or hurt others.
- •Indulging in uncivilized behaviour or using abusive language.
- •Bullying or using any form of physical / emotional violence against a fellow student or any member of the staff.
- Brusting crackers or throwing colour on one another within or near the school premises.
- Using unfair means during a test / examination.
- •Indulging in any misbehaviour / misdeed directly or online which could be derogatory for the institution or any person.

General Instructions

- •Participation in games and sports / extra- curricular activities will help in overall personality development.
- Students will insist their parents to sign school dairy.
- •Drink deep at the fountain-head of knowledge; make wise use of library daily.
- •The students should appear in all the exams throughout the year.
- •Students should obey House Captains and other students on duty.

Warning Cards

The following disciplinary measures can be adopted by the school:

- 1. Oral warning and counseling; fine, Written warning Issue of white, red and yellow cards.
- 2. Expulsion
- **I.** White Card : A student is issued White Card if he remains absent from school for two successive days without prior intimation or leave of absence to him.
- **II. Red Card:** A student will be issued a Red Card for missing classes, reporting late to class, constantly. interrupting the teaching process and indulging in rude and unacceptable behaviour in the classroom. The students will report to the Class Teacher for detention during break.
- III. Yellow Card: Yellow card will be issued to a student undulging in serious offences like bunking, destroying or damaging school property, brusting crackers, using unfair means in the examination, disobedience, rowdyism or violence in any form. A yellow card holder will not be allowed to avail any privilege in the school during the period stipulated on the card. Such a student will not be allowed to attend any programme, picnics or outlings.

Bus Rules


- •The school transportation is privately managed.

- •It is also requested that any issue/ problem related to school/ transport may be discussed with the school authorities/ transport in- charge in the school only.




